



What is it?

De Quervain's syndrome is a painful condition that affects tendons where they run through a tunnel on the thumb side of the wrist.



1. Pain on the thumb side of the wrist, as shown in the diagram. Pain is aggravated especially by lifting the thumb, as in the hitchhiker position or when using scissors.

- 2. Tenderness if you press on the site of pain.
- 4. Clicking or snapping of the tendons occurs occasionally.



It appears without obvious cause in many cases. Mothers of small babies seem particularly prone to it, but whether this is due to hormonal changes after pregnancy or due to lifting the baby repeatedly is not known. There is little evidence that it is caused by work activities, but the pain can certainly be aggravated by hand use at work, at home, in the garden or at sport.

What are the Back to top symptoms?

- 3. Swelling of the site of pain compare it with same spot on the opposite wrist.



HandsFirst QI Collaborative

This quality improvement (QI) project will focus on improving the quality of care for hand trauma patients. The project aims to improve outcomes for these patients by reducing variation and reducing time to surgery for this patient group.

Proposed project goal

That 80% of hand injuries that present to any service on the day of injury and require surgical intervention should have their first operation within the timeframe given in the BSSH hand trauma standards.

The British Society for Surgery of the Hand (BSSH) worked with the James Lind Alliance to identify and prioritise the questions that people with any experience of common conditions of the hand or wrist, and the health care professionals who treat them, consider important to be answered by research in the future. The focus was on adult conditions which are treated by hand specialists, rather than by other specialists, such as dermatologists.





It has the 9th highest rate of road traffic deaths in the world 31/100,000 - predicted to double in the next 10 years


7% of all deaths are due to injuries and for every death, there are 25 injuries causing permanent disability


